


# Sights

## Felsenmeer Odenwald

Block Field

**Information:** The Felsenmeer above Lautertal-Reichenbach is a particularly impressive block field formed during ice age. It was later used by the Romans as a stone pit. Today, it is a popular leisure sight.



**Information Centre:** opening hours: 10am – 4pm

**Guided tours:** for 10-30 participants possible, rate up to 10 participants: 75€ basic fee, rate for more than 10 participants: 75€ basicfee plus 5€ individual fee per participant

**How to get there:** trains start at Frankfurt Central Station every hour, cost about 14€ (one way), take 1h 35min

## Saalburg Roman Fort

**Information:** The Saalburg is a Roman fort located on the Taunus ridge northwest of Bad Homburg, Hesse, Germany. It belongs to the Limes Germanicus, the Roman linear border fortification of the German provinces. The Saalburg is the most completely reconstructed Roman fort in Germany. Since 2005, as part of the Upper German limes, it forms part of a UNESCO World Heritage site.



**Opening hours:** 9am - 6pm

**Entrance fee:** 3.50 - 5€

**Guided tours:** 60€ basic fee plus 3.50€ entrance fee per person max. 30 participants

**How to get there:** trains start at Frankfurt Central Station every half an hour, cost about 8€ (one way), take 45min

## Keltenwelt Glauberg

**Information:** The Glauberg is a Celtic oppidum in Hesse, Germany consisting of a fortified settlement and several burial mounds. Archaeological discoveries in the 1990s place the site among the most important early Celtic centres in Europe. It provides unprecedented evidence on Celtic burial, sculpture and monumental architecture. An archaeological park has been built, with the aim of making the site and its context accessible and comprehensible to visitors and providing a space for exhibiting the finds locally.



**Opening hours:** Tuesday - Sunday 10am - 6pm

**Entrance fee:** 3.50 - 5€

**Guided tours:** different guided tours possible (registration is required in some cases), take between 60 and 210min, cost between 8 and 15€per participant

**How to get there:** trains start at Frankfurt Central Station every hour, costs must be asked for at the station, take 1h

## Loreley

**Information:** The Loreley is a rock on the eastern bank of the Rhine near St. Goarshausen, Germany, which soars some 120 metres above the waterline. It marks the narrowest part of the river between Switzerland and the North Sea, and is the most famous feature of the Rhine Gorge, a 65 km section of the river between Koblenz and Bingen that was added to the UNESCO World Heritage Sites in June 2002.



**Tourist Center:** opening hours: 10am - 5pm

**Information:** A former residence of the Electorate of the Palatinate, Heidelberg is the location of the University of Heidelberg, well known far beyond Germany's borders. Heidelberg is a popular tourist destination due to its romantic and picturesque cityscape, including Heidelberg Castle and the baroque style Old Town.

**Entrance fee:** 3 - 10€ (depends on exhibition)
